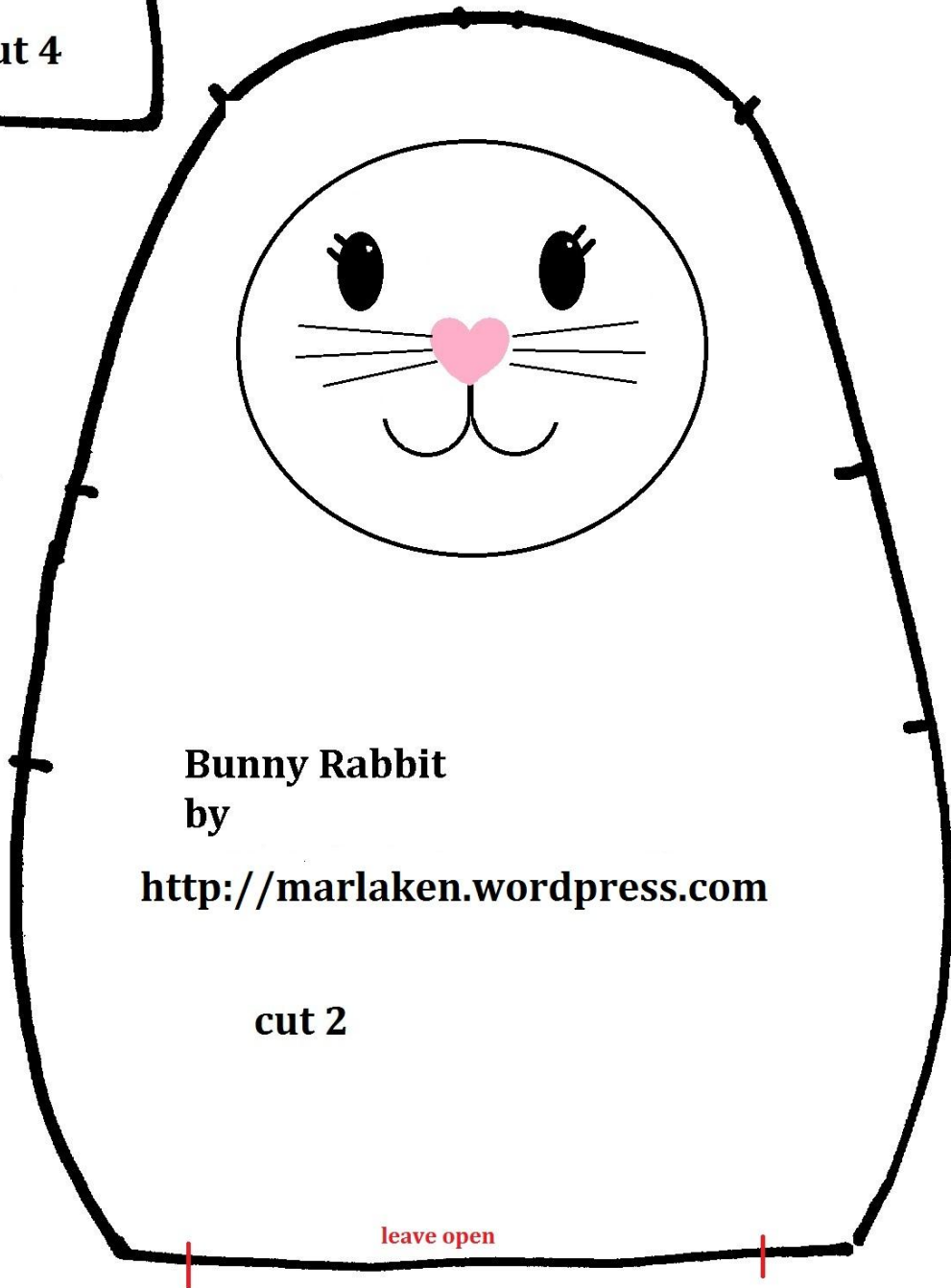
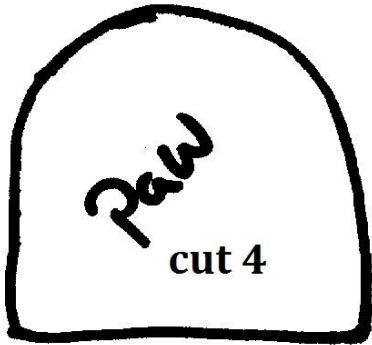
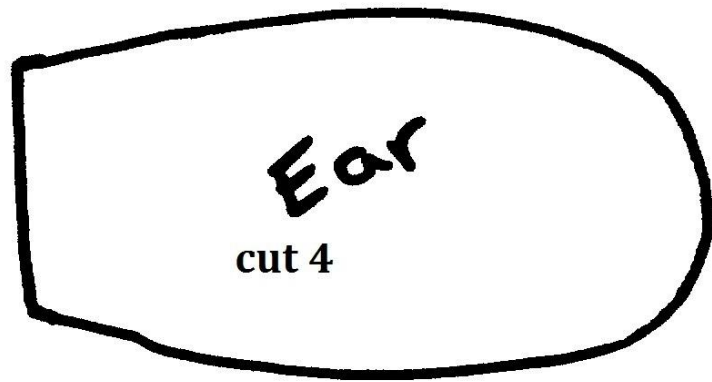


Add 1/4" seam allowance

Directions:

You will need a piece of fabric about 10" by 20" for main construction and a small 4" square for face. I used heat and bond to fuse face. And fiber fill for stuffing.

Cut out pattern: You will need 4 ears, 4 paws, 2 bodies and one face. **Add a ¼" seam allowance to the pattern.**

For the ears: I put the wrong sides together and stitched round the ear then used pinking shears to cut around the edges. Leaving the straight edge unstitched. (You could sew the right sides together and turn the ear if you want a different look.)

Paws: Right sides together stitch around the 3 sides (leaving straight edge open) Turn right side out, and put a pinch of fiber fill inside of paw. This is softly stuffed.

Face: fuse face on right side of front body and then stitch around outside edge.

Using the marks on the pattern pin ears and paws into place. They should be to the inside of the body on the right side. Now pin the back body piece on the front with right sides together and stitch all the way around leaving an opening at the bottom so you can turn the bunny right side out. Stuff bunny with fiber fill and hand stitch the bottom.

For the face: I painted my face with fabric paint. You could embroider, sew on buttons, and use pieces of felt, whatever you like. If for a young child I would not use anything they could swallow.
